# Raffle Block "Monochromatic Samples This makes a 9" block 91/2" unfinished ! This makes a 9" block 91/2" unfinished ! Lets try for a scrappy look using Christmas Fabrics \*\* Supplies List \*\* Color 1 Medium: Four 3 - ½" X 3 - ½" Color 2 Light: Four 2" x 2" Square and Twelve 2" x 2"

#### \*\* Sewing the Block \*\*

Using a scant 1/4" seam( now and throughout the block making!) sew together three Color 3 and one Color 2 2" square to make four of the corner units shown . Press seams to darker side where applicable. These should each measure 3-1/2"...

Now lay out the pieced corner units, the Color 1 squares and the Color 3 3-1/2" square as shown . Sew three horizontal rows, alternating pressing directions by row. Sew the rows together to finish up the block!...

# **Tips and Tools Page**

# Presidential Sewing/Quilting Tip of the Month

When organizing a small quilt/sewing project and you need to go to the store and match up more fabric, you will want to create a one-of-a-kind design board. Place already cut small swatch samples to the sticky side of a lint roller sheet. Add buttons or trims also. Then place the lint roller sheet in a zip-loc bag, allowing the sticky sheet to stick to the bag. A All of your samples will be organized and clearly seen thru the bag. No more swatches falling to the bottom of your purse. Peel and stick as you add new items to your design sheet. Then you can write on the bag all important information about the project.

# Abnaki Tips

- 1. At camp have coffee before you start sewing in AM
- 2. Pressing is always worth the time
- 3. Put magnet inside flap on purses
- 4. Read and follow instructions
- 5. Put your name on quilts and other projects
- 6. don't use rotary cutter after 11pm or after having a martini.
- 7. Measure twice cut once
- 8. Lock finished projects up at night while at quilt camp
- 9. Remember many of these tips are useful whether at camp or at home.

In November we welcome international quilting expert Annie Smith from San Jose, California. A specialist in fabric selection and fine machine appliqué, Annie is well known for her innovative podcast for quilters, *Quilting Stash*, where she shares with us her interviews with both upcoming and seasoned experts in the quilting world. She has recently joined the new wave of quilting teachers who now offer classes on the internet. <u>http://simplearts.com</u>

We still have a number of openings for the companion workshop to Annie's lecture . This is a great opportunity to learn from a popular, nationally known quilting instructor at a very reasonable price. The cost of the two day workshop is less than a one day workshop at most places. So if you can't commit to both days, you might consider just taking the first day on fabric selection. Please help us fill workshop by passing this information on to your friends in other guilds.

#### Lecture (November 3) Understanding the Value of Color

Annie takes you through a journey of color and fabric, discussing what the KEY to your fabric choices really is. No matter what your skill level, learn how enliven your quilts' personality by choosing your fabric with a new eye to color. The keys to fabric selection are thoroughly discussed as well as how to make the color design rules work for you.

#### Workshop (Two day workshop): Exploring Fabric Choices

\* As seen on Alex Anderson and Ricky Tims' *The Quilt Show*. Dates: Wednesday & Thursday, November 4 & 5 Time: 9:00-3:30 Location Day 1: Yankee Pride Quilt Shop, Essex Junction (no sewing machines this day)

Location Day 2: United Church of Colchester, 900 Main St., Colchester (sewing machines)

Cost: \$45 plus \$16 kit fee payable to Annie on day of workshop

Traditionally, quilters often struggle making fabric choices when planning a quilt. Learn exactly what draws the eye to interesting blocks and give them life. Annie helps you select colors for your projects **on purpose** instead of by-gosh-and-by-golly. Keys to effective fabric selection are thoroughly discussed with hands-on exercises using fabric swatches, and helpful aids. Day 1 focuses on exercises that help a quilter choose a palette of fabrics for making a quilt. Participants will make a series of paste-up blocks and discover the many variations the palette offers when making these blocks. No sewing machines required this day. On Day 2 participants will finish quilt top using the first day's key block exercises, learning many of Annie's finishing tips.

## Quilt Drop Off and Pick Up Information

#### Drop-off Date: Wednesday, November 11th

#### Time: Between 4-7PM

**Place**: Faith Methodist Church on Dorset St. in South Burlington. Note: We will be using the same classroom as last year, not the large meeting room. Use the second door in from Dorset St. It will be obvious when you get there. Our classroom will be to your left and easy to find. Because our workspace is limited, it will probably help if socializing is done in the hallway, and entry into the room kept to a minimum.

Additional instructions: **PLEASE, PLEASE, place your quilt in a plastic bag for the show**, as requested, unless your quilt has some unique special needs (and then it is asked that you talk to me about it ahead of time). At the end of the show we must have the bags back under each quilt within 10-12 minutes, and there is no way we can handle the variety of "creative packaging" that is increasingly showing up and still continue our speedy take down and quilt return. Your cooperation will really be appreciated.

Use a separate bag for each quilt. We will have a few extra bags if you need them. **Be sure to bring your paper-work.** We handle a lot of quilts and all forms are necessary to help us keep track of them. Please use safety pins to attach form #3 to the quilt back (unless you like blood on your quilt ---straight pins can be lethal).

#### If you are unable to deliver your quilt at this provided time, try to get someone else to bring it for you.

#### AT THE CLOSE OF THE QUILT SHOW

#### If you are picking up a quilt:

- 1. We will aim for the **quilts to be available by 5:30PM.** Please come then or soon thereafter.
- 2. All quilts must go through the desk and the proper paperwork. Do not

collect your own quilt, even if you are a "take-down" person. For us that

comes up as a missing quilt. Don't send us into panic!

#### Remember to bring your pick up receipt with you.

If you cannot pick up your quilt, it would be most helpful if you can assign someone else to retrieve it for you. Just be sure they have your form #2. It is possible to have it mailed back to you, but this can get expensive and takes a fair amount of work. Please try to provide an appropriate sized box if you have dropped off your quilt and then need it mailed back to you. Service is not provided to mail your quilt on to a third party.

Please contact me if you can fill any of these positions. I will be sending reminder postcards to all volunteers – this will also be your free admission ticket to the show. Thank you! Laura


