Join us in welcoming Allison Wilbur as our speaker on May 4th. Allison is an award winning longarm quilter and quilt artist. She has spent decades of living overseas and traveling abroad. This exposure to many beautiful fabrics has helped her bring global textiles, color combinations and design elements into her quilts.

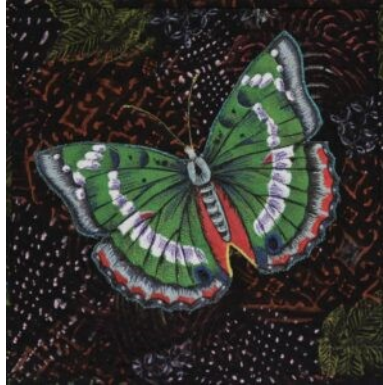
Allison will be presenting her lecture, Fabulous Fabric Selection. Allison talks about color, value, scale, repetition, and the many elements that are key in making your quilt sing. This is a great lecture to help you use your stash and learn to branch out in your fabric combinations.

In addition to Allison's lecture, you can sign up for her Saturday May 4th 3 hour workshop entitled, Color in Quilting. After a run through of color theory with many examples, we will start playing with colored charm squares to get a hands-on understanding of how colors play off of each other and effect one another. "An out of the way covered bridge near Marshfield once served as a gathering place for young bandsmen. (The Colburn bridge over the Winooski River, near Cate Farm.) The boys rigged up the bridge by laying plank across the lateral bracing creating a kind of second floor. Lanterns by which they could read music hung on rafter nails, and sap tubs were used as seats. Six or eight would be musicians could while away many an hour in the lonely but cozy retreat, free from interruption with nobody to mind the discords. One traveling thread salesman got the scare of his life when he passed the bridge on a gloomy night. His friends wouldn't

believe it when he swore to the ghostly with strange light and music coming out of a bridge you could see clear through!"

TREASURER'S REPORT AND PROPOSED BUDGETS

CVQGVY Members – The Board presents two budgets for July 1 2021- June 30, 2022 – General and Quilt Show budgets for your review and member vote in June. The projected Quilt Show budget (Oct 2022) anticipates a \$1,335 profit. The General budget projects a loss of \$760. Combined budgets project a profit of \$575. (The Board plans a smaller Quilt Show venue scheduled beyond the upcoming fiscal year, but certain expenses will accrue this fiscal year.) The general budget reflects optimism to resume meetings in August at Holy Family Parish Hall requiring hall rental (\$175/meeting) and resumption of liability insurance (\$650). Fundraising efforts include Quilt Raffle (\$2000), Membership (\$3200), Contributions (\$1500), a trunk sale (\$400), Workshop events (\$450) and Guest fees (\$300). These conservative budgets are based on a brave new world where members & guests may safely gather while adhering to Vermont health safety guidelines and the efforts and generosity of our members. The Board plans to broadcast via Zoom gatherings for members and guests who want to participate online. The Guild's mission is to promote the art of quilting in our community; therefore the largest budget item is \$5,000 for quality lectures from regional and nationally recognized speakers. We encourage Guests and Members to continue to make friends, show your artwork, make community gifts, and support of the Champlain Valley Quilt Guild of Vermont – 41 years strong.

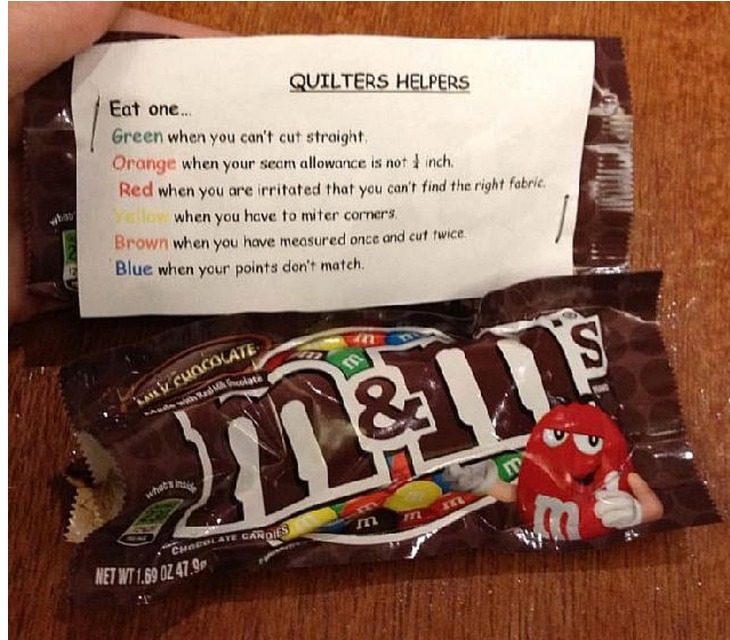
