Nola A. Forbes of St. Johnsbury, Vermont will be one of the special exhibitors at our quilt show in October. She has enjoyed a career as an educator of mathematics and computer programming. She is a 35-year member of the Kirby Quilters; past President of Green Mountain Quilters Guild; volunteer and former Trustee for the annual Vermont Quilt Festival. She demonstrates traditional and contemporary techniques, teaches and judges for many quilt venues throughout Vermont.

As a seventh generation Vermonter, she also enjoys genealogical research. She has a deep appreciation for the heritage that quilts and their makers have developed. Join us at the September meeting as Nola shares the research on her family's "Eastman/ Beede Signature Quilt". Who were the people that signed this quilt? Why can't I find the last one? This cotton crazy quilt has 53 signatures from 4 generations of Eastman and Beede family members. The home for many of them in the early 1900's was in Washington, Vermont. Nola will describe the research she undertook to help identify these spirits and bring them back to life. Perhaps you will discover an early family quilt that needs your help in a similar manner.

Winter Warmth Project Update

Since I agreed to take this over from Pam Druhen earlier this summer, I've met with her a couple of times to talk about how she managed the project, materials she has available and the remaining need in the State. Pam donated over 700 quilts during the past year but 800+ families are still living in temporary locations waiting to get back into their homes or rebuild their homes. So although Hurricane Irene happened a year ago, there is still a great need within our State. I am planning to manage this larger project for this Guild year and would plan to shut the project down by August 2013 with the assumption that we will have reached as many people as possible in the two years following the storm. I'm looking for a few core people to assist me in managing this greater State-wide effort.

If you have a few hours available to make phone calls to emergency centers, contact other guilds within the State, or reach out to quilt shops perhaps, I would appreciate the help. We need information to be collected so that an assessment for the remaining needs for Winter Warmth quilts can be made. I'd like to work more actively with other guilds within the State to have them help meet the remaining need once that's been determined. Our own guild will continue to work on our own Winter Warmth quilts which is part of our Community Quilts effort. Any quilts we make, will contribute to the larger State-wide effort. Pat Delaney is an award winning quilter specializing in color, home machine quilting, appliqué, and embroidery. Currently, Pat focuses on creating quilts and teaching these skills to other quilters. Her quilts have been displayed in regional and national shows, and she has won numerous awards and recognition for her work, including First Place (Traditional Pieced) from IQF and several awards at the Vermont Quilt Festival

Pat's quilts have been shown on the Discovery Channel and published in the *Boston Globe, Brockton Enterprise,* and *Abington Mariner*. They have also appeared in *Quilter's Newsletter Magazine, American Patchwork & Quilting, Quiltworks, Quilter,* Quilt Art Calendar, and on the cover of American Quilter's Society catalog of books and *Quilting Foundation Piecing*.

Tired of the same old stippling? Perk up your machine quilting with a new vocabulary of designs for filling spaces and backgrounds. Heirloom quilting is done with little or no marking. You will end up with a portfolio of stitches to get your creativity flowing. Pat will discuss using background fills, choosing a design to go with piecing shapes and fitting designs to the quilt both by marking and unmarked. Some time is spent on feather shape and style and this class will show many of her favorite designs that she uses in her beautiful quilts. This will be a stress-free class that, Pat hopes, will help many to break through to the next level of their quilting!





November 6, 2012: Pepper Cory (Beaufort, NC)

Pepper's love of quilting began in 1972 when she purchased an antique quilt at a rummage sale. Since then she has been collecting quilts, making her own quilts, writing books about quilts, designing needlework tools, and sharing her love of quilts and quilt history through lectures and workshops all over the world. Pepper has appeared on *The Quilt Show* with Alex Anderson and Ricky Tims. Her articles have appeared in *Quilters Newsletter Magazine*, *Traditional Quiltworks*, *American Patchwork & Quilting*, the *Fabshop* Magazine, and *Ladies Circle Patchwork Quilts*. She has authored/co-authored seven books including *Quilting Designs from the Amish* and *Mastering Quilt Marking*.

November 6 Lecture: The Art of Real Scrap Quilting

What defines a scrap quilt today? Are there any boundaries when making a scrap quilt? Listen to famous quiltmakers' views on scrap quilts and see examples from Pepper's personal collection. Pepper's most popular lecture!

November 5 Workshop: Antique English Folded Log Cabin

(Evening workshop for all skill levels. Hand stitching, quilt-as-you go.)

This quilt pattern, popularly known as Log Cabin, is one many American quiltmakers assume was home-grown. But the Log Cabin pattern may in fact have originated on a tiny island off the coast of England! Called the Roof Tile pattern on the Isle of Man (located between Ireland and England), the pleated quilt-as-you-go block is pieced and quilted at the same time without batting. The blocks are then joined, front to front, and the backs' foundation fabric whip-stitched together. This block is an excellent introduction to hand stitching and has the advantage of being

totally portable for today's busy quiltmakers. This ancient pattern is a super addition to your quilting skills and one you can teach kids and do at any time and any place.

See tracing of antique whole-cloth quilts, learn how judges evaluate quilting, how to cut a stencil, what tools work best for marking-an information-packed class that's a real confidence booster. Kit for \$3 includes authentic Amish design quilting stencil and paper for marking experiments. Pepper's book Mastering Quilt Marking is optional but advisable. (most popular full-day class)

Note From Our Treasurer

Hello, folks!

Welcome back to another season of guild activities! What a great summer it has been but I am definitely looking forward to the slower pace of fall and winter – not to mention the cooler temperatures. I have spent a little time this summer closing out the books for the guild for the year. Our guild operates on a calendar year which runs from July 1 to June 30. The ending financial statement for FY2012 is presented on the next 2 pages and I have tried to present it in a manner that makes sense. The general operating information is on page 8 and the quilt show financial is on the second page. The total for the quilt show is carried forward to the general financial as one line item in order to see how we fared as a whole. The individual amounts for FY2012 are shown netting expenses from any income generated from the activity. For the most part, there is no directly related income.

We thought we'd ease everyone into the new Guild year by working on a very easy block that can make a stunning completed quilt. Although the directions are for a single block, it would not be much more work to have long strips and make a whole slew of blocks. Have fun and see you at the September meeting.



Cutting instructions -

5 Strips 1 3/4" wide x at least 7" (use long strips & make more)

1 - Navy Blue

1 - Yellow

3 - Scrappy Mediums

Note – the consistent dark and light strip on either end will make the rail fence pattern stand out when blocks are assembled.

Sewing -

Not much to explain. Sew strips together with Navy on one side and Yellow on the other. Place 3 Medium fabrics between the 2 where they look best.

Please note that it is important to take SCANT 1/4" seam allowances. When we sewed true 1/4" seams our blocks were too narrow.

Press all seams to one side. Assure you have 6 ¾" unfinished width of the block.

Trim length of block to 6 3/4" (unfinished). Make lots, they are easy.
