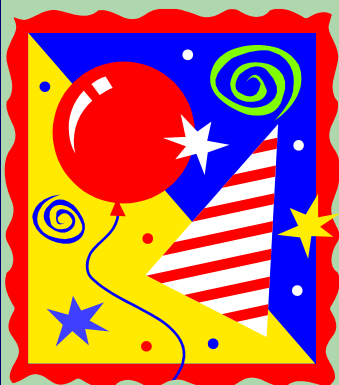

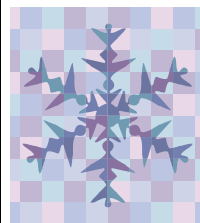

### **Newsletter Guidelines and welcoming contributions to the Sharing Corner:**

It would make the editing process faster if these guidelines could be followed. I am aware that the age of the software and the computer can differ but if you can, please observe these guidelines for newsletter contributions:

1. First **THE DEADLINE FOR CONTRIBUTIONS IS THE 15th OF EVERY MONTH** the guild meets.
2. Use the Tahoma font, regular and size 11. Make sure line spacing is single or "1sp" and that paragraphs have "0 pt" before and after. This feature alone simplifies the editing process tremendously.
3. Check your contribution for spelling errors. Make sure you have used the apostrophe 's where needed; use the ACTIVE voice whenever possible. For e.g., "I stitched it" instead of "It was stitched by me." Instead of using "...", please use the "—" OR ";", whichever seems more appropriate. Thank you.
4. I prefer word documents as I cannot edit PDF files. Exceptions of course are spreadsheets. For spreadsheets make sure they fit within the margins of a 8.5" x11" page in portrait or landscape orientation. Photographs are welcome as ".jpg" type.

**I would also like to remind members of the Sharing Corner and welcome contributions. Here are the guidelines again:**

5. You have to agree that I will decide whether to include your article or not. Usually, inclusion will depend upon space constraints and/or subject contents.
6. Your information must pertain to the use of needle and thread. I would love to hear from you if you have had a quilt selected for a show, book, magazine or newsletter OR if you have been a quilter for a long time and want to communicate to others the reasons why you love the art.
7. Internet links and tips on how to improve one's quilting skills are welcome. Have you discovered a gem of a quilting shop? Is there a book and/or article that you found particularly useful in our library or elsewhere?
8. Do you have a service you can offer members? Do you need a ride to our meetings or make a donation?
9. Finally, if you can, please observe editorial guidelines listed as 1 to 4.
10. No computer? Handwrite the article and mail it to me. My address is on page 8.

I hope to hear from you and please don't let this list daunt you. I am here to make this as exciting a newsletter as I possibly can and will listen to suggestions and positive and negative feedback. Please send them to [newsletter@cvqgvt.org](mailto:newsletter@cvqgvt.org). THANK YOU.

## **JANUARY RAFFLE BLOCK** **9 PATCH VARIATION**

An easy block since you will all be busy during the holiday season.



We know you can do a 9 patch in your sleep so here is just the basic information you need to make the block as pictured.

Block size is 12" finished or 12 1/2" unfinished.

To get some texture we recommend using prints that read as solids rather than true solid fabrics.

For a single block please cut:

White on White – Qty 3	4 1/2" squares
	Qty 3 1 7/8" squares
Black on Black -- Qty 3	4 1/2" squares
	Qty 3 1 7/8" squares
Red on Red -- Qty 2	4 1/2" squares
	Qty 3 1 7/8" squares

- 1) Construct the Center 9 patch as shown using all of the small squares (3 of each color).
- 2) Cut down if necessary to 4 1/2".
- 3) Use the constructed block as the center for the 9 Patch finished block. Be sure the center block is oriented correctly so the blacks and whites are together and all the reds in center and corners line up with one another.
- 4) Block should measure 12 1/2" unfinished.

The more blocks the merrier!

We appreciate the great participation this season. At both the October and November meetings, there were enough raffle blocks to divide and have 2 winners each month. So please, keep them coming and we hope you are our next winner.

Again we suggest for Extra Credit –

Make more with the personal set of fabric/colors of your choice for a sampler quilt to keep or perhaps for a Community Quilt. Feel free to do more than one of each block, skip some months or whatever works for you.
