What are some of the best tips to prepare your quilt for machine quilting – both domestic and long arm? Kay and Janet will share the techniques they have collected over a total of 26 years of machine quilting. As long arm quilters, they want your quilt to look fabulous and these tips and details help give you the results you desire. Last year this presentation earned them many positive reviews from members of their own guild, Maple Leaf Quilters of Rutland.

Kay Bergquist purchased her first long arm quilting machine in 1994 and has been working with quilters to make their tops into quilts since then. She is always glad to share tips with fellow quilters to help them improve their skills. Kay designs quilt patterns and teaches around Vermont using these quilt patterns.

FEBRUARY RAFFLE BLOCK LINCOLN LOG CABINS

We're thinking of **Presidents Day** by making 'Lincoln' Log Cabins in bright, patriotic colors.

You'll need a bunch of **red, white and blue fabrics** -- it would be nice if a few of them evoked patriotic themes, but don't buy anything special. We like the whites to have some print to them rather than read too solid, makes the block more interesting.

These directions are based on standard piecing, but if you prefer to do your log cabin on a foundation, go for it....

Cutting Fabric --

Center – Red square -- 2 ½ inch unfinished
Rest of block – various red, whites and blues
1 ½ inch strips

Piecing --

Start with the red center square.
Sew a contrasting strip to one side of the red.
Press toward the new strip.
Cut off strip even with the square.
Continue adding strips in a clockwise fashion,
pressing toward outside as you go &
cutting strip even with last portion.
Use **3 strips** on each side of the center block.

There is no particular order of colors expected except for the center red. Otherwise use the red, white and blue colors as you choose.



Blocks should measure **8½" unfinished**.

The more blocks the merrier! The more chances you have to win a bunch.

Again we suggest for Extra Credit –

Make more with the personal set of fabric/colors of your choice for a sampler quilt to keep or perhaps for a Community Quilt. Feel free to do more than one of each block, skip some months or what works for you.
