2016 Location Survey

Thank you to everyone who took the time to provide information for our Location Survey which was conducted earlier in the summer. The response was great...over 100 responses!

The main charts which provide the breakout of responses to the 3 main questions can be found on our website. Go to About Our Guild and click on Survey. The link to the survey is <http://www.cvqgv.org/survey.html>

We learned that 72% of us attend 4 or more meetings with 50% attending more than 6 of our 10 meetings per year.

Of the 86 respondents to the question asking about the major drawbacks of attending, the responses were mixed with 38% responding that a particular month's topic was not of interest. 27% felt it was too far to travel and 17.5% each either no longer drive at night or are away for a part of the year. Over 40% responded with "Other" and provided reasons such as the meetings being too late, busy with other activities, bad weather, and illness.

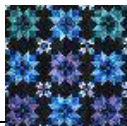
Regarding actual location, the majority prefers remaining at Essex Alliance or has no preference. Essex Alliance is where we have scheduled 8 of our 10 meetings for the 2016-2017 Guild year. 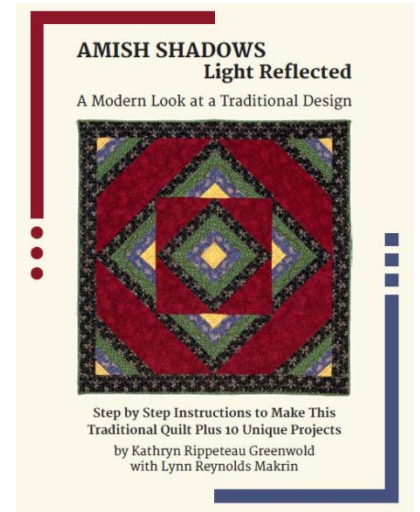
Lecture - Amish Shadows Light Reflected

This lecture is based on the book by the same title, written with Lynn Reynolds Makrin. We will discuss Amish quilting styles in general and the Amish Shadows quilt in particular. It includes a trunk show of the quilts featured in the book.

Workshop - Broderie Perse



This workshop includes a discussion of the history of Broderie Perse appliqué quilts, both in Europe and the United States. Various methods for achieving the special effects desired will be demonstrated. Each participant will use print fabrics of her own choosing to create a unique wall hanging or quilt block. Machine and hand embroidery will be discussed. Lots of examples will be available for participants to see.

Lecture: Capering with Creativity and our Quilts

Wander with Wendy as she guides you through an eclectic collection of traditional and contemporary quilts, all with a common thread - captivating color. She will offer ways of taking a few small steps or multiple bold ones in experimenting with color. Wendy will then explore ways of approaching the color challenge using a tried and true tool - the color wheel.

Workshop: The Third Dimension, Embellishing with Tantalizing Threads.

Confident beginner to advanced-Students need to have some experience using a darning foot

Explore exciting embellishing techniques for textural surface design!! Come join us in this technique and project based class. Beginning with fused design elements and our darning foot, we will explore tantalizing threads, couching, the basics of machine bobbin drawing, use of tulle and water soluble stabilizer and the many ways these techniques can be used for eye-popping results. This is a technique and project class. We will work on an experimental piece and possibly begin a mini piece during class using a student's original design or a pattern that students can purchase the day of class for \$10



Raffle Block of the Month

September Strip - (no sewing required - due Sept. meeting)

- Bring a 2 1/2" x WOF (width of fabric selvage to selvage) in any cotton fabric that "SAYS" AUTUMN; batiks, printed, solids.
- Enter your name in the basket for each strip you bring.
- Let's see how many jelly rolls (40 strips) we can give away.



October Raffle Block (red, white and blue signature block for quilts of valor - due October mtg.)

At the September meeting, pick up cut Red, White and Blue strips at the Raffle Block table to construct your block or feel free to use your own 2 1/2" strips (width of fabric selvage to selvage) . Each set of 3 strips will make six 6 1/2" (unfinished) blocks. Blocks will be "sold" for \$1.00 at our Quilt Show for signatures and well wishes to raise funds for Quilts Of Valor supplies.

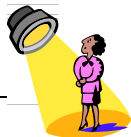
