Meeting Minutes—June 6, 2023

President Jo Frymire opened the meeting at 6:03 and invited everyone to come up and eat a wonderful potluck dinner. Our guest veterans were asked to help themselves first.

President Frymire called the meeting to order at 6:45. Linda Lane, representing the Quilts of Valor group, said there were more kits on the back table to make more quilts, as well as signature blocks. Linda turned it over to Andre Emmel for the presentation. Andre gave a history of the Quilts of Valor program, which began in 2003. As of this 20th anniversary year, 345,647 quilts have been awarded nationally. He then introduced our veterans, and each was presented with a quilt.

Chris Wrobel, Treasurer, asked if there were any questions about the proposed budget. There being none, the budget was passed unanimously.

Nancy Suarez, Vice President, reviewed the slate of officers. There were no additional nominations, and elections were unanimous:

Linda Park announced that the Membership Committee would like to receive dues for the next year from August to October. Payment can be made by check at the meetings, or sent to Linda, or on the CVQG website.

Barbara Newman reported on Community Quilts. Camp Ta-Kum-Ta has been given 25 quilts. 107 pillowcases will be delivered to the pediatric ward at the hospital later this month. Sleep in Heavenly Peace has already received 9 quilts. There is also a need for Fidget Quilts. Fabric is available from the Shed for those who would like to sew up more quilts and pillowcases.

Jo announced the theme for the Quilt Show in April is "Seams Like Spring".

Sue Rivers drew the winning ticket for the Raffle Quilt – Cheryl Bodge from St. Albans. The additional quilt, created from the leftover fabric by Carol Bloomhardt, went to Sue McGuire. Sue R. also has a schedule to sell tickets at the Fair in August for this next year's Raffle Quilt, and requested that people sign up,

Chris announced that there would be a Sew-In at Yankee Pride from 10-2 on June 10 to assemble the Raffle Quilt.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:18 for Show and Tell.

For this new year, the Community Quilt Committee is excited to continue to provide quilts to our local community for those who need a little joy and comfort. We need you! Last year we were able to donate 10 quilts to Sleep in Heavenly Peace, 25 quilts to Camp Ta Cum Ta, over 20 quilts to Habitat for Humanity and over 40 quilts to the Children's Hospital at UVM. We exceeded our goal of 200 pillowcases for the year (100 in December and 100 in June). Over 35 fidget quilts were distributed Thank you so very much to everyone

The Guild will have fabric and kits available at most in-person meetings and sew-ins. Batting is also available by asking the Community Quilt committee to cut you the size you require, maximum length is 92". Kits consist of a pattern or suggestion for piecing and some fabric. The goal is to piece a top, width should be 50"-65", length 60"-90". Additional fabric will be available if you do not wish to use fabric from your stash.

Consider attending a sew-in to help assemble kits or work on a quilt. We need you! Our next sew in is August 4 from 10-2 at Yankee Pride. Join us in the air-conditioned comfort. Stay for as long as you'd like. Bring lunch if you'd like. We are planning some Saturday sew-ins and monthly sew-ins at Yankee Pride on the third Thursday beginning in September. Details soon.

October 3 - Quilt Restoration by Judith Eisenberg



Judith recently moved to Vermont after a career of textile conservation and as a professor at the Fashion Institute of Technology in New York City. She will tell us about her work, why and how textiles are preserved or restored and show examples of some of the guilts and other textiles she has worked on.

November 7 – Julie Poirier Mathur

Julie joins us from Quebec outside of Montreal to show examples of her body of work including Portrait, Contemporary, and Fantasy quilts. She has exhibited works at Salon Courtepointe Quebec as well as in travelling exhibits throughout Canada and Internationally.

Workshop November 8 – Julie will lead a Workshop the day after the meeting on computer techniques used for quilting, more information to follow.
