


## Champlain Valley Quilters Guild December 2023

### Champlain Valley Quilt Guild November 7, 2023

President Jo Frymire called the meeting to order at 6:57.

### Announcements

Linda Lane had asked for more wall quilts to fill up the space at the Charlotte Senior Center to be displayed with the Challenge Quilts from 2023; she is collecting them now.

Barbara Newman announced that the Guild has produced 115 pillowcases for the Pediatric Ward at the hospital; 11 quilts have also been donated. More fabric is available for Guild members, and Barb showed a simple design for a Cat Quilt. She also reminded everyone about the Sew-Ins at Yankee Pride on the third Thursday of the month where more pillow case kits may be available.

Sue McGuire introduced the speaker, Julie Poirier, who gave an enthusiastic presentation about using apps to design and enhance her quilting.

### Business:

Raffle Quilt: Jo pointed out the Raffle Quilt displayed on the new rack, and encouraged everyone to sell tickets.

Retreat: Marti delNevo said that all spaces have been filled up for the retreat in February.

Challenge Quilt, 2024: Linda Lane explained the Challenge Quilt, due at the last meeting of the year in June. One should use three initials of your name as inspiration: one for main color; one for pattern; one for quilt motif or embellishment. A full explanation will be found on the CVQG website. Linda also explained new directions for making the hanging systems for the quilts to make them much easier to display. Programs: Sue McGuire announced she is resigning as co-chair in December, and urged members to volunteer to fill the vacancy.

She also asked to change the time of the February meeting to accommodate the speakers who live in Ireland. Since this is a Zoom meeting, it was agreed to begin at 5:30.

Quilt Show: There is a need for totes for the raffle at the show. Members were asked to make totes, and fill them if possible. This is a great fundraiser! Jo also reminded everyone to be working on their quilts for display at the show in April.

December Meeting: The Holiday Party is scheduled for the next meeting. Everyone should bring 1. Food to share; 2. Their own drinks, dishes, and silverware; 3. A fat quarter of fabric for the games.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:34 for Show and Tell.

### **COMMUNITY QUILTS FOR PEDIATRICS AND DECEMBER NEWS**

40 pillowcases and 22 quilts have been delivered to Children's Hospital at UVM Medical Center. Thank you to all who participated. We will be taking another group of quilts and pillowcases into the hospital in early December. Please drop off completed projects at the sew-in and at the guild meeting.

There will be more kits and fabric available for you to pick up at the December guild meeting and sew-in. This will be our last in-person meeting until March, so pick up supplies for your winter sewing.

Fabric and instructions for the pillowcases will be available at the December guild meeting and at the sewin. We recommend that you make two at a time from two complimentary one-yard pieces of fabric so you can switch the cuffs. Flanges are optional. We have a collection of binding fabric available for you to use.

If you have a top ready to quilt, please contact Barbara. She will bring a pre-cut batting to you at our meeting.

We had a wonderful time in November. You will have another opportunity to join us on Friday, December 2, any time between 10 am- 3pm at Yankee Pride. Drop in for our fabulous First Friday Sew In. ### TREASURER'S REPORT—SEE PAGE 3 FOR THE NUMBERS

Happy Thanksgiving! The Guild mid-year financials are summarized as follows:

- → The total net assets are \$41,000 earning \$85 monthly from CD investment. Net revenue to date is \$4,591.
- → The Actuals to Budget of \$25,855 (income and expenses) reflect to mid-year total income \$10,380 (40%) and total expenses \$5,589 (21%).
- → Income of \$10,380 primarily consists of: Membership dues (80%), Raffle Quilt Revenue (78%), and Fundraisers (17%) i.e. Retreat & Quilt Show.
- → Midway, expenses are low to date (21%) covering hall rental, storage unit, website maintenance, community quilt supplies, and office admin.
- → Notice that Fundraising income and expenses are the largest budget items as we prepare for February Retreat and April Quilt Show.
- → These two events push our normal budget of \$10,000 annually to \$25,855 this fiscal year with a goal of a zero balanced budget.
- → Thus, we have much work ahead of us to generate \$15,000 more in income and keep our expenses on target.

As Treasurer, I assure you the Guild funds are secure and financials are on target and healthy. I also urge every member to continue to grow our membership, contribute towards our fundraising goals to provide superior programming, participate in our fundraising events, and enjoy warm friendships, awesome community giving while promoting the art of quilting in our community. Happy Holidays.
