Community Quilts – Barbara Newman said 6 quilts were presented to a big family through Habitat & 5 to Quilts Across America. She thanked everyone that is helping make quilts and emphasized the availability of donated fabric to be used in projects.

Retreat – Jo thanked Marti DelNevo for her work on making the retreat last week a success. She expects a lot of Show and Tell in March from all the projects that were in process during the retreat.

Quilt Show – Jo reported that advertising rack cards and flyers have been mailed by Sue McGuire to quilt shops and vendors. She reminded everyone to continue work on tote bags and collect items to fill them. Community Quilts has lots of fabric available for totes, a tote only "Tote-a-rama workshop is being considered. Marti has patterns.

Registration for quilts will open in March, Carol Bloomhardt is coordinating; only one quilt per person will be accepted. All but one vendor has been contracted by Nancy Suarez. Volunteer signup sheets will be available from Linda Park soon so think about when you would like to help. There will be lots of donated books on the craft table. Jo clarified that only exhibited guilts can be sold. Small ones can be at craft table, the guild gets a share of the proceeds.

The meeting was adjourned shortly after 7 pm.

COMMUNITY QUILTS

Thank you so very much to those of you who have donated items to Community Quilts. We have donated 6 more quilts to Habitat for Humanity, 20 fidget quilts to memory care units, 9 quilts to Quilts Across America for Sleep in Heavenly Peace so far this year. We continue to collect pillowcases and juvenile quilts for Children's Hospital at UVM. Look for pillowcase kits at the guild meetings and sew-ins.



If you are making a top for the community, batting is available by asking the Community Quilt committee to cut you the size you require, maximum length is 92". We have also recently acquired some larger pieces of fabric that may be used to piece backings for community quilts. Remember the best



backings for community quilts. Remember the best size for community quilts is twin size. The minimum size for most cozy quilts is 50x60.

There will be a monthly sew-in in March at Yankee Pride on the third Friday of the month, March 15 from 10-2. You are welcome to attend to work on a quilt for the community or for yourself. It's a great time to socialize and see what everyone else is doing. Stay for as long as you'd like. Bring lunch if you plan to stay. Hopefully there will be a Saturday sew-in sometime in March.

Again, thanks for sharing your gift of quilting to spread comfort and joy to those in our community.
