Champlain Valley Quilt Guild March 5, 2024

President Jo Frymire called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Joanne Lattrell introduced the speaker, Elaine Quehl from Ottawa, joining us virtually via a Zoom link to the church hall. She gave a most interesting presentation "From Inspiration to Art Quilts" describing her journey taking classes and working in series to find her voice. She also gave tips like embracing newness, quieting your critical voice and practice, a lot.

Announcements

Sue McGuire discussed a quilted postcard swap with Ireland. She had a signup sheet and passed out directions and portions of an iron-on Pellon that could be used. A total of 19 members signed up to make postcards. When addresses are received from Ireland, she will assign one to each participating member.

Nancy Suarez, as VP, is in charge of preparing a slate of candidates for the Guild board with elections to be held in June. She asked for nominations or interest from anyone interested in being an officer or on the board. One of the Programs Chair positions is open. If interested in that or any other job, contact Nancy or Jo. She also noted that board meetings are held by Zoom so no one thinks being on the board requires a commitment to more in-person meetings.

Mary Neighbours just returned from the "Road to CA" show and at the Sew Powerful booth learned about quilters making purses to donate and be filled with feminine products for African girls who tend to miss school several days a month without them. She passes around a card about the program. Pat Ganson said a Vermont woman, Margaret Schelley is involved with a program with same goals called "Days for Girls". Only 1 quilt per person will be accepted but the form asks if you have another in case we have room. That will depend on the size of the quilt and space available. She asked that we don't wait until last minute to register.



Call For More Quilts for Camp Ta Kum Ta— May deadline!

Community Quilts Committee is currently collecting quilts for Camp Ta Kum Ta summer camp. Camp is designed for pediatric oncology patients to give them a healthy "normal" camp experience. "Until there is a cure, there's camp!" The kids range in age from 8-17. Some of them are in active treatment for their cancer. The quilts should be bunkbed size, minimum 50 x 60. We need more for the teens- minimum 60 x 75. If you have a pet or smoker at home, please launder your quilt in unscented detergent before delivering it to us. Our goal this year is 35 quilts. We already have 20! Please deliver them to the guild in April or May or to the sew-in on Friday, April 19 at Yankee Pride 10-2. We will deliver them before the June guild meeting. Contact Barbara Newman with questions. Thanks for brightening the lives of the kids and their families.

Community Quilts- Please return the quilts you are quilting for us! Thank you so very much to those of you who have donated items to Community Quilts. We continue to collect pillowcases and juvenile quilts for Children's Hospital at UVM; 40 pillowcases and 4 quilts went to them last month. Another Habitat for Humanity home will be done soon. We plan to donate 4 quilts to 2 families- double bed and twin size. Look for



that may be used to piece backings for community quilts. Remember the best size for community quilts is twin size. The minimum size for most cozy quilts is 50x60, if your quilt is smaller, we can use it for our donations to Children's Hospital.

There will be a monthly sew-in on **Friday, April 19 at Yankee Pride from 10-2**. You are welcome to attend to work on a quilt for the community or for yourself. It's a great time to socialize and see what everyone else is doing. Stay for as long as you'd like. Bring lunch if you plan to stay.

Again, thanks for sharing your gift of quilting to spread comfort and joy to those in our community.
